Palm Bay Fire-Rescue consists of:

- 129 Employees (118 certified FFs)
- Emergency Services (5 Fire Stations)
- Fire Prevention

Training

Firefighters participated in over **15,615** hours of training in 2010.

Average number hours of training per firefighter in 2010 is **145**.

Fire-Rescue Accomplishments 2009/2010:

- Implemented a new WEB-based Fire and EMS tracking System, which allows for the assignment of training programs and the tracking of completion.
- Transferred Fire/EMS Dispatch to Brevard County, saving the City salary dollars by eliminating the need for fire dispatchers
- Worked with Bentley Architects and Engineers, Inc. to finalize design specifications for the new Station 1
- Added state-of-the-art traffic directional sign board to Engine 5 for improved visibility and personnel safety while on scene, particularly at highway events.
- Implemented In-Service Fire Inspection Program: Began annual fire inspections of 1,006 multi-family and light industrial buildings by Fire-Rescue response units.

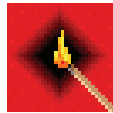

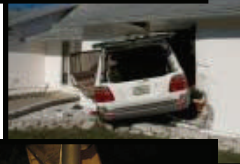

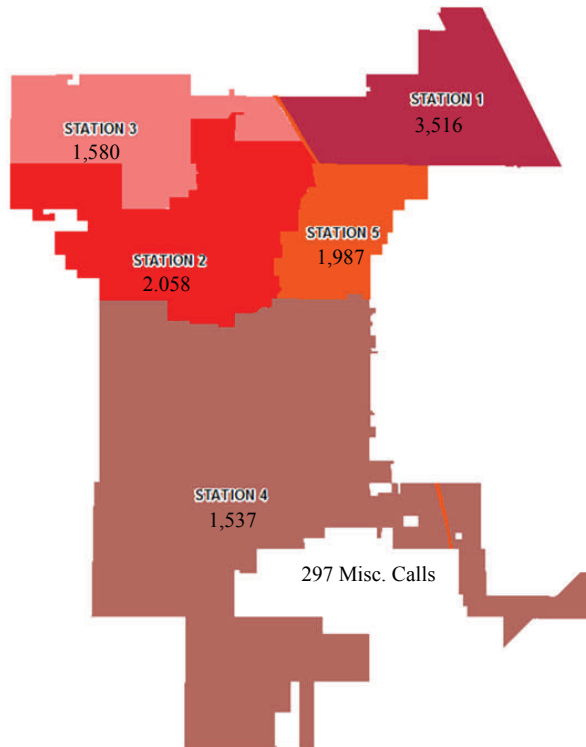

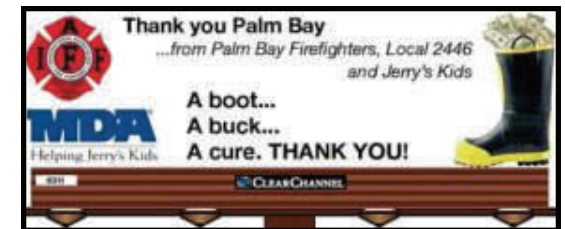
